PROPERTY OVERVIEW













Dating back to the 18th century, the Château de la Borde is a classic freestone, slate-roofed mansion, offering a surface area of approximately 400m2. The estate comprises four buildings (300m2) in addition to the château:

- A guest house offering 100m2 of living space
- A summer house of 50m2
- Stables (converted into garage and game rooms) enclosing about 150m2
- A tiny chapel

The 7 hectares (17.3 acres) of land offer gardens, vast lawns, woods, a pond, and direct access to the river Dême.



A BRIEF HISTORY

I. Alexis de Tocqueville

All château have their histories; Sometimes those histories are as remarkable as the château itself. The Château de la Borde, located like so many others in the Loire valley, was the place where Alexis de Tocqueville wrote his seminal four volumes entitled: "Democracy in America". Perhaps more than any other, Tocqueville captured the essence and significance of the young American republic.

The mansion's first owner of renown was Gustave de Beaumont (1802-1866), who was born and who died there. A magistrate, he was a close friend of Alexis de Tocqueville and also the grandson-in-law of Lafayette. Although Tocqueville had his own château in Normandy, it was in the company of Gustave de Beaumont, who also had accompanied him on his American travels, that he wrote his famous work.

A BRIEF HISTORY

II. CLAES OLDENBURG

The next notable in the history of the Château de la Borde was its acquisition and remodeling under the inspiration of the Swedish-American artist Claes Oldenburg and his wife Coosje van Bruggen.

Mme. van Bruggen stated "I think what Claes and I have looked for above all in our home here is a simplicity of form—but a simple form with layers of meaning, which open up one by one like a sculpture the more deeply you look into it."

Today, their art works and furnishings have been removed, but their contemporary touch remains..

"The skill with which the parkland has been turned into a landscape of winding paths and subtly contrasting groups of trees is fully matched by the radical but seamless way van Bruggen and Oldenburg have renovated their house. 

ACCESS FROM PARIS

Idyllic in so many ways, the château is located in the most famous of châteaux territories: the garden-like Loire valley, near such great names as Chambord and Chenonceau.

Thanks to the TGV (high-speed rail lines) the château can be quickly accessed either from Tours, Le Mans, or the newer station called Vendôme TGV.

In all cases, the direct train trip takes about 40-50 min, and the same amount of time to reach the front door of the château. Total travel time from Paris can thus be estimated at 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours. Driving from Paris would require 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours.



BEAUMONT-SUR-DÊME

North of the nearest small city of Tours, the Château de la Borde sits at the edge of the village of Beaumont-sur-Dême. The small river that gives its name to the town also runs gently across the grounds of the château.

It is rare for a château to have a village at its feet, and remarkably convenient for daily baguettes and produce. Beaumont-sur-Dême boasts its own attractions, such as an award-winning boxwood garden.

The larger village of La Chartre-sur-le-Loir, offering a traditional farmer's market and other commodities, is just 5 minutes away by car.




